THE NEED


- 4 out of 10 children are born to unwed mothers
- There are 64.3 million fathers nationwide, out of those, only 14 million actively care for their children
- 2 Million Fathers are raising their children alone


STATISTICS SHOW

- 1 in 9 mothers suffer from postpartum depression
- About four out of five abusers are the victims' parents
- 45% of children who live in a single parent home are food insecure
- Suicide was the third leading cause of death among individuals between the ages of 10 and 14

Is the annual cost for children in foster care per year

- 59% of single mothers do not receive financial assistance from the noncustodial parent
- 54% of single fathers are raising 3 or more children alone and make less than \$50,000 per year in the U.S

STUDIES REPORT

Children from fatherless homes when compared to children who come from a home with a father are:

- 5 times more like to commit suicide (USDHHS Bureau)
- 32 times more likely to run away from home (Criminal Justice & Behavior Department)
- 20 times more likely to have a behavioral disorder (Criminal Justice & Behavior Department)

THE SYNERGY

The Synergy is exclusive to parents who have children between the ages of 0–5. This program focuses on the development of a child in connection with the attachment and engagement of a healthy family relationship.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

P.A.P.P.S is a parental engagement program initiative that is unique. This program is a combination of peer recovery mentoring, educational facilitation, resource development, supportive services and coaching development all wrapped into one.

We utilize an evidence based curriculum paired with a practical facilitation for the program. A scope and sequence mentor based guide designed to assist parents of children who are simultaneously undergoing a youth development mentoring program. With the goal of enhancement to the entire family, P.A.P.P.S is not only clinically based, but peer supported.

Studies show that individuals are more willing to open up and receive with their peers rather than with a professional with no personal experience to their situation.

Created to enhance an entire family, P.A.P.P.S is a supportive function of an emotionally, mentally financially and economically home that is self-sustainable and safe.

Program Goals

CHILD MALTREATMENT

Through P.A.P.P.S., we intend on increasing awareness on child abuse and reducing child maltreatment through parent education and suicide prevention awareness.

FINANCIAL LITERACY

P.A.P.P.S. educates families on banking processes and how to build a financial portfolio to decreases poverty.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Our program teaches parents how to recognize domestic abuse and how to minimize the effects of previous abuse.

INCREASED KNOWLEDGE

This program presents increased knowledge of effective communication skills, parent advocacy and other skills relevant to family dynamics.

COMPONENTS OF THE PROGRAM



The activities that Purposeful Parents P.A.P.P.S program will conduct to accomplish its goals are as follows:

- Providing participants with related support through peer development groups
- Virtual web contact sessions via computer software
- Informed conversation
- Subject matter curriculum based on life skills & parenting



The Program Provides:

- Training on the importance of self-care, healthy self-esteem, encouragement of confidence, and implementing self-motivation
- Utilizing the pain of previous trauma and implementing it into purpose (ACE Therapeutic Model, Adverse Child Experiences), and WRAP Processes
- Awareness to parents granted for subject matter relevant to children; bullying, suicide, violence, sexual education, risky behaviors



Education Enriched Training:

- Providing participants with credit, budget, and money skills that provides an opportunity to make informed and effective decisions with financial resources
- Understanding and building a healthy relationship with credit
